IHST Releases Schedule for Worldwide Helicopter Safety Symposium

Keynote Addresses by NTSB's Robert Sumwalt and Robinson CEO Kurt Robinson

The International Helicopter Safety Team (IHST) has released the full program for its seventh worldwide helicopter symposium for safety professionals. The event takes place on Feb. 27-28 at the Anaheim Convention Center immediately following the close of Heli-Expo 2014.

The theme of the symposium is "Self-Discipline and Personal Responsibility" and it is open to all aviation safety professionals and all within the worldwide helicopter community. Feature speakers and presenters include:

The IHST promotes safety and works to reduce accidents. The organization was formed in 2005 to lead a government and industry cooperative effort to address factors that were affecting an unacceptable helicopter accident rate. Prior to 2006, the number of worldwide civil helicopter accidents was rising at a rate of 2.5 percent per year. Since 2006, the number of accidents worldwide has been decreasing by an annual rate of 2 percent.
